





State Fiscal Year 2016-2017




- 204 sales

16. ADDITIONAL, SALE RELATED WORK
 Herbicide Application Plan

The plan must include a map of the sale area showing the location of the herbicide application points. The plan must also include a description of the herbicide to be used, the application rate, and the timing of the application. 
